

Activities and experiences provided for your child



It is a requirement of the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) statutory framework that we inform parents about the activities and experiences children will enjoy in our setting. All children in our early years setting are encouraged to join in with a wide variety of activities and experiences during the sessions they attend.

Children learn through play in our setting and our activities and experiences are drawn from across the educational programmes linked to all 7 areas of learning:

- Communication and language
- Personal, social and emotional development
- Physical development
- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Understanding the world
- Expressive arts and design.

Activities and experiences the child might be involved in include, for example:

- Fun play in the setting, outside in the garden and regular outings into the local community.
- A wide range of adult-guided activities when we read books, sing songs and play games together.
- Planned small group learning experiences such as cooking, playdough, music and movement etc.

Parents will be kept informed about their child's learning and we will send regular updates about what their child does during their time here. We welcome and encourage parents' comments and information about what their child is learning at home, places they have visited, new home interests etc so we can build on their home learning when they are with us in the setting.
